Please keep in mind that the words listed, taken out of context, may seem more offensive than they would in the context of the play.

# Bandstand

## By Richard Oberacker & Robert Taylor

**Synopsis:** Set in 1945, "Bandstand" follows World War II veteran Donny Novitski as he returns to Cleveland and struggles to rebuild his life. To honor his fallen comrade, Donny forms a band of fellow veterans to compete in a national radio contest. When he connects with his best friend's widow, Julia, their shared grief and love of music help them heal and find hope. This Tony Award-winning musical explores the challenges faced by returning veterans while celebrating the healing power of music.

#### **Special Effects/Events:**

- Loud music and orchestration
- Sudden loud sounds (drum beats, instrument crashes)
- Battle flashbacks with lighting effects
- Possible strobe or flashing lights during performance scenes
- Haze/fog effects
- Sound of explosions or gunfire

### Language:

- Moderate profanity including "damn," "hell," "son of a bitch"
- Military slang
- Period-appropriate language from the 1940s
- References to battle and death

#### Drugs/Alcohol:

- Characters drink alcohol frequently
- Depictions of alcohol use as self-medication

- Scenes in bars and clubs
- References to cigarette smoking

#### Violence:

- Flashbacks to battle experiences
- Combat sequences (stylized)
- Physical altercations between characters
- Self-destructive behavior

## Possible triggering/objectionable experiences:

- Direct depiction of post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD)
- Themes of grief, loss, and survivor's guilt
- Discussion of suicide and suicidal thoughts
- References to combat deaths
- Scenes depicting veterans' mental health struggles
- Discussion of war injuries and disabilities
- Military funeral references
- Depiction of emotional trauma and flashbacks
- Themes of war's impact on families and relationships
- Discussion of difficulty reintegrating into civilian life
