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#### <u>The Mountaintop</u> by Katori Hall

tagline: a warm and dramatic look at the last night in the life of Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr.

## THE STORY:

Tired from delivering one of his most memorable speeches, Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr. tries to get some rest in a little motel on what he does not realize is the night before his assassination. His people have all gone off to seek shelter from a breaking storm and his only company is a maid who works at the motel. Their encounters that night, playful, respectful and challenging, open the door to a humorous, compassionate, sometimes down-to-earth and sometimes otherworldly sharing of the Reverend's life, nature and dreams—and his ultimate destiny.

# WHY THIS PLAY WAS CHOSEN

Since the outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic and the great migration of talent, it has become increasingly difficult for theatre producers to cast plays. Nevertheless, Managing Artistic Director Melissa Chin-Parker has begun the process of bringing in new actors to expand the scope of The Western Stage's offerings. As an artist and as a person of color herself, she is bringing *The Mountaintop* to the Salinas stage as one of many important stories written from brilliant BIPOC artistic points of view. As this process continues, it will, in turn, afford more opportunities for BIPOC actors and create a richer cross-cultural experience at Western Stage for artists and audiences.

Having grown up in the 'Sixties herself, Melissa feels that this play brings out the truth of the time, how it has influenced current times, and how it will inform the future. She was profoundly moved by playwright Katori Hall's recreation of a very human Martin Luther King, Jr. As a great martyr of the 'Sixties, like those of other times, he is often come to be thought of as a saintly symbol, which detracts from his true call for others to not sit on the sidelines but to take up action. This Dr. King is a man who cared deeply and worked hard to make the United States live up to its promises to *all* of its people. His human flaws, as reflected in the play, are not evidence that he was not worthy the respect, but neither are they hidden from the audience. His non-violence was not passive, and his passions were aggressive. This production will demand that the audience experience Dr. King's anger, frustration, humor and pathos, and ultimately, great empathy for someone who envisions a better future for his children even as the shadow of death looms prematurely. Dr. King was one human being and one voice, but his words will echo and inspire many through the centuries.

Katori Hall of Memphis, Tennessee, won the 2021 Pulitzer Prize for Drama for her play, *The Hot Wing King. The Mountaintop* won her the 2010 Olivier Award for Best New Play. She also received the Susan Smith Blackburn Award, the Lark Play Development Center Playwrights of New York (PONY) Fellowship, two Lecompte du Nouy Prizes from Lincoln Center, the Fellowship of Southern Writers Bryan Family Award in Drama, an NYFA Fellowship, the Columbia University John Jay Award for Distinguished Professional Achievement, the National Black Theatre's August Wilson Playwriting Award and the Lorraine Hansberry Playwriting Award.

Ms. Hall is also a television creator/producer. Her Starz drama series, *P-Valley*, adapted from her stage play, received Gotham, Independent Spirit, GLAAD Media, and NAACP Image Award nominations.

Ms. Hall's other works include the award-winning *Hurt Village*, which is currently in development as a feature film; plus *Hoodoo Love*, *Saturday Night/Sunday Morning*, *WHADDABLOODCLOT!!!*, *Our Lady of Kibeho*, *Purple is the Colour of Mourning* and *The Blood Quilt*. Her most recent accomplishment was to write and produce the hit Broadway musical, *Tina: The Tina Turner Musical. This earned her* a Tony Award nomination for 'Best Book of a Musical' and as producer in the 'Best Musical' category. When *Tina* received a production at the West End, Katori received an Olivier nomination for 'Best New Musical.'
